

## NOTICE OF DATA EVENT

Richard D. Jones, A Professional Law Corporation DBA Jones Mayer (“Jones Mayer”) is providing notice of a recent data privacy event that may affect information related to certain individuals. The confidentiality, privacy, and security of information is one of Jones Mayer’s highest priorities and it takes this matter seriously.

In November 2024, Jones Mayer became aware of suspicious activity within our network environment. Jones Mayer took steps to secure its environment and launched an investigation to determine the nature and scope of the activity. The investigation determined that between August 22, 2024 and November 7, 2024, an unauthorized actor accessed certain systems within the environment and copied certain files. Jones Mayer undertook an extensive and time intensive review of what information was potentially impacted and to whom that information relates. Although Jones Mayer has no evidence of any misuse of the information in connection with this incident, it is providing notice to those whose information was present in its systems.

While the information impacted varies by individual, the types of information that could have been impacted includes: Social Security number, driver’s license number and/or state identification number, financial account information, medical information, health insurance information, full access credentials, biometric data, passport number, taxpayer identification number, and vehicle license plate number. At this time, there is no evidence of any identity theft or fraud occurring as the result of this incident.

Jones Mayer is providing notice and complimentary access to credit monitoring services to individuals whose information was impacted in this event. Jones Mayer also notified relevant state authorities, and law enforcement. Jones Mayer encourages impacted individuals to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review account statements, and to monitor their credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Jones Mayer is providing impacted individuals with contact information for the three major credit reporting agencies, as well as providing advice on how to obtain free credit reports and how to place fraud alerts and security freezes on their credit files.
